WHAT IS TITLE 1?

Revenue source of categorical supplemental programs

Designed to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on state academic achievement standards and assessments.

Funds MUST be used to supplement core programs to enhance student achievement

Cannot pay for classroom buildings, reading and math curriculum, etc.

TITLE 1 FUNDING



- 1.Funding based on number of low income students (free/reduced lunch program)
- 2. Our school works on "School-wide Program" so that Title I supports ALL STUDENTS needing academic support to reach grade level standards

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Our students thrived in 21-22! Our students in grades 3 - 6 increased their English Language Arts score on the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) by over 11% and increased their math scores by almost 6%.

Garden Valley was 1 of 3 schools given the TRUSD Diamond Award for our outstanding academic achievement and earned the 2022 California Department of Education Pivotal Practice Award.

Goals for 2022-2023:

Garden Valley will increase the number of students meeting the achievement standard, as set by the CAASPP assessment, by a minimum of 10% in English Language Arts by June 2023.


Garden Valley will increase the number of students meeting the achievement standard, as set by the CAASPP assessment, by a minimum of 10% in Mathematics by June 2023.
